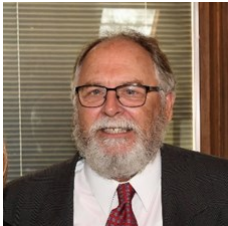

FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

ALL'S WELL THAT ENDS WELL!

I attended a pastor conference many years ago. The presenter was Dr. Walter Bouman, at that time, a New Testament professor at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Ohio.

Dr. Bouman was a coveted speaker for such conferences, being a widely read author of many books, and a popular lecturer and teacher.

As such, Dr. Bouman spent much time on the road. One of the things Dr. Bouman shared with us was his penchant for reading mystery novels. Understandably, these mystery novels gave him an intellectual break from his otherwise steady diet of sophisticated theological abstracts and publications.

But what was *not* so clear about Dr. Bouman's get-out-of-town escape into novels, was his habit of reading the *last* chapter of these mysteries, *first*. "What?" Isn't the intrigue of these books anchored in the suspense of *not* knowing "who did it" throughout the book, and then only in the end, finally putting together all the elements of the story as the mystery is solved?

Dr. Bouman's explanation of his unconventional reading behavior was this: "By reading the *last chapter first*, I am able to better focus on the people and events that, in the end, really matter, while not getting bogged down in, or overly concerned, about fruitless details."

By reading the last chapter of the book first, deeper attention is paid to the people and events which in the end matter. *Their* significance is not missed and comes to light *as* one travels through the text, solidifying greater insight into the things that matter most.

Whether you agree with Dr. Bouman's approach to mystery novel reading or not, know this, it is the methodology that the church has adopted in reading the story of Jesus Christ and his redemption of the world. We begin the story of Jesus by reading how it ends. That methodology is manifest in the liturgical sequence by which the story of Jesus is told.

We *began* the church year with the four Sundays of Advent. "What are the themes of Advent?" They are focused on the return of Jesus...preparing us for the *end*. The chapter of Advent relieved us of unwarranted fear of people, places and events in our lives that ultimately do not matter, thereby keeping us focused on how it all will end. And the very happy (eternal) ending we've proclaimed marginalizes all detours we encounter along the way!

Knowing from Advent how all mysteries of life are finally resolved, we moved forward in the story of our Savior identifying Him as the incarnate Jesus (Christmas) and move on now to the next chapters of His life that unfold: insight into his message to the world (Epiphany) and how redemption is accomplished (Lent).

May God bless your worship this February as mysteries as solved, and the joy of how all things end, comes into your life to focus your concern and attention where it belongs: on the redemption of the world!

SUNDAY AND ZOOM WORSHIP

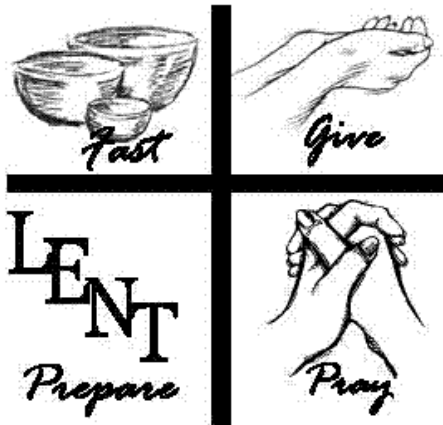
Sunday worship at Grace is at 10am followed by refreshments and Christian fellowship at 11:00am.

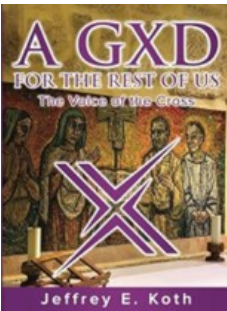

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. This is a time for reflection and devotion on the cross of Christ. How could such a terrible death accomplish so much good.

Pastor Koth has published a book on the cross of Christ called "A GXD For the Rest of Us." This book explores the *unique* perspective that St. John brings. St. John's is a view of the cross which reveals it, not as a vehicle to pay for the sins of the world, but rather as the place of enthronement of the Son of God and the ushering in of the Kingdom of God.

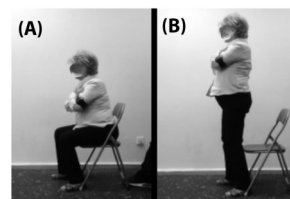
WORSHIP LEADERS

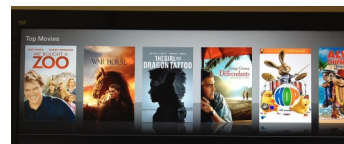
SR. CENTER ACTIVITIES WITH SUE DAVISON
